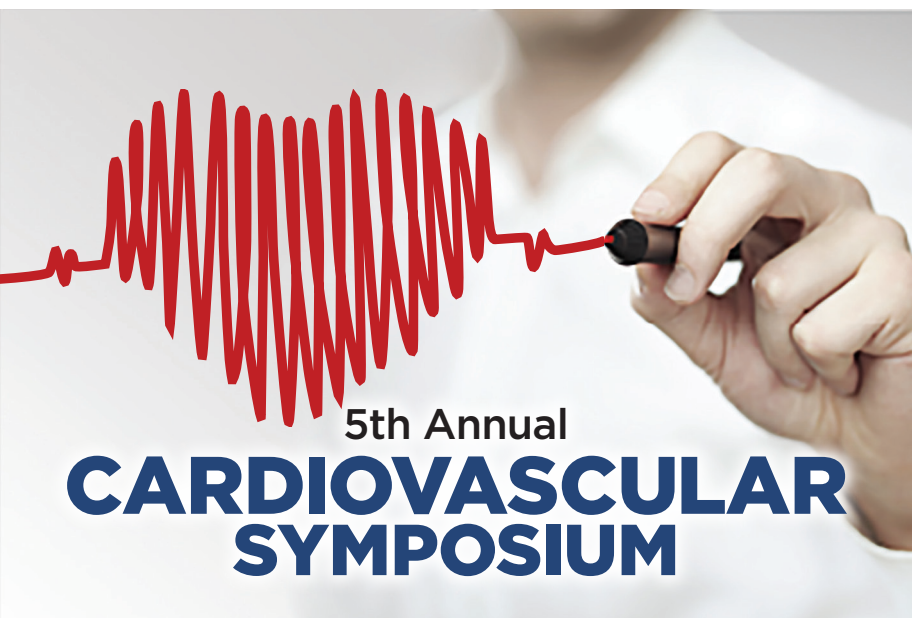

DR. JOANN LINDENFELD

Keynote Speaker

JoAnn Lindenfeld, MD, FHSA, is the Director of Advanced Heart Failure/Cardiac Transplantation for Vanderbilt University and is co-founder of the Center for Women's Health Research at the University of Colorado. She earned her medical degree from the University of Michigan Medical School.

Dr. Lindenfeld began her career investigating the role of anemia in the regulation of cardiac output, which subsequently led her to develop the heart failure and transplant program at the University of Colorado.

She has extensive experience in the direction and oversight of large multicenter randomized clinical trials in heart failure, heart transplantation, and mechanical circulatory support. Her work has contributed to improved anticoagulation in recipients of left ventricular assist devices, the development of models to predict the risk of peripartum cardiomyopathy, the discovery that women with heart failure are more likely to have heart failure with preserved ejection fraction, and the development of a model that determines specific phenotypes of heart failure with preserved ejection fraction.
